MOVING OUT? GET RID OF UNWANTED ITEMS



The City of Signal Hill is asking residents to use the City's free disposal programs instead of putting unwanted items at the curb. The City of Signal Hill offers a FREE pickup program to get rid of unwanted items that are too big to fit in the trash can such as furniture, appliances, and mattresses. Residents can call EDCO direct at (562) 597-0608 and request a pick up. Tenants moving out of their apartment can use the program too.

Residents can also drop off unwanted computers, TVs and other electronics at the EDCO Disposal and Recycling Center located at 2755 California Avenue in Signal Hill. The Center is open Tuesday through Saturday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. and it's FREE! EDCO also collects harmful waste products and household toxic items including e-waste, medicines, batteries, used motor oil, paints and other chemicals. These items are collected the second Saturday of each month. HOW THE CITY OF SIGNAL HILL GOT ITS NAME

In the 1500's, Puva Indians used the hilltop to signal other native tribes on Santa Catalina Island, 26 miles offshore. Because of its use as a signaling point, Spanish settlers called the hill "Loma Sental," which translates to "Signal Hill."

Sustainability Awards from the Signal Hill City Council

The Sustainable City Committee nominated and selected the property at 3372 Myrtle Avenue for a Sustainability Award. Ellen and William Janssen recently replaced the front yard turf with colorful, drought tolerant plants. At the City Council meeting held on Tuesday, August 8, 2017, Mayor Edward H.J. Wilson presented the Sustainability Award in the category of Water Efficient Landscape to the Janssens.



Beautification Awards from the Signal Hill Planning Commission

On Tuesday, April 18, 2017, the Planning Commission presented Beautification Awards to Gary Severns, for the property at 1790 E. Burnett St., and 2H Construction, for the property at 5563 Walnut Avenue.



Mr. Severns restored the 1919 Craftsman style home with period appropriate custom Craftsman doors, windows, fixtures and tile. The original interior stairs and fireplace were restored and two additional Craftsman period fireplaces were added along with solid oak floors, a new electrical system and copper plumbing. The existing deck was expanded to 1,575 square feet, taking advantage of the panoramic views from the entire property. A new four-car garage and workroom addition replaces the original garage which was converted to an additional living space on the lower

level of the home. The grounds of the property were completely re-landscaped and feature river-rock planters, pathways with decorative pavers, a circular drive with a central planter and wrought iron fencing.

The building at 2653 Walnut Avenue was constructed in 2016. It offers 7,573 square feet of office space in a contemporary architecture design including an open ceiling, glass rails, high end finishes, an inviting staff kitchen and break room space, spacious offices, and even a basketball free-throw court.



On Tuesday, May 16, 2017, the Planning Commission presented a Beautification Award to Crisell + Associates, the property owner of 2199 E. Willow Street, for the contemporary and attractive redesign of the building's exterior.

The building at 2199 E. Willow Street was built in 1981 by David Cohee and Lee A. Crisell. It has been the home of Crisell + Associates ever since. The building's exterior and landscaping was updated previously in 2009. Now it has been updated again, with a bold, new color scheme, and eye-catching signs. ■



WATER CONSERVATION IS EVERYBODY'S RESPONSIBILITY



The City of Signal Hill is under a Level 1 Water Supply Shortage. Watering and irrigation is allowed Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday only. Watering or irrigation is prohibited between 9:00 am – 4:00 pm. Watering or irrigation of any lawn or landscape

is limited to 15 minutes per day, per station. Washing down hard or paved surface is prohibited except when necessary to alleviate safety or sanitary hazards. Using water to wash or clean a vehicle is prohibited except by use of a hand-held bucket or similar container, or a hand-held hose equipped with a positive self-closing water shut off nozzle or device. ■

A MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF

There is a new high school in Long Beach located next to the City of Signal Hill city limits. Robert D. Browning High School, located at 2180 Obispo Avenue in Long Beach opened its doors on August 30, 2017 to 150 incoming freshman. The opening of the school creates new traffic issues for drivers.

When driving within 500 to 1,000 feet of

a school while children are outside or crossing the street, the speed limit is 25 mph unless otherwise posted. Always drive slowly and carefully near the school to avoid accidents. Be on the lookout for bicyclists and pedestrians crossing the street at Obispo Avenue and Hill Street as well as Redondo Avenue and Hill Street.

As everyone returns to school for the 2017-2018 year, the Signal Hill Police Department would like to remind all parents to abide by the following safety tips and to share information with their children to help keep them safe:

Walking to school:



- Always walk with a buddy or group
- Look both ways for oncoming traffic before crossing the street
- Always walk on a sidewalk or designated walkway
- Pay attention to your surroundings and do not walk and use electronics
- Cross at a corner, in a crosswalk, and obey the crossing guard's commands and / or WALK signal

Taking the bus to school:



- Stand at least 6 feet away from the curb while waiting
- Be sure the bus driver can see you
- Never walk behind the bus
- Do not put your head, arms, or legs out the window

Riding a bicycle to school:



- Always wear a helmet and make sure it fits properly
- Ride on the right side of the road
- If riding during darkness, make sure the bicycle is equipped with proper lighting devices and reflectors
- Ride while alert and do not use electronics or wear both earbuds while riding

Animal Care Services

All dogs four months old and up are required to have a current dog license by local municipal code (SHMC 6.08.010). To purchase a dog license, the owner may come to Community Services Department at City Hall with the current rabies inoculation certificate (must be good for the entire licensing period), and a certificate of sterility if the dog has been spayed or neutered. The fees are \$95 unaltered, \$20 altered, and \$25 late fee. Seniors (age 60+) have a discounted rate of \$10. This discount is for one altered dog per household only; all others are at regular rates.

Signal Hill Community Garden



Join the Community Garden and meet your neighbors while reaping the benefits of your seasonal harvests. There are a limited amount of plots available at this time. Plots are \$95 per year and measure 10' x 12'. Please call the Community Services Department at 562-989-7330 for more information.

Transportation
