

SIGNAL HILL'S 95TH ANNIVERSARY

IS COMING SOON!

In April 2019, the City of Signal Hill will be turning 95. To help us celebrate, we're looking for historical photos and your personal stories of Signal Hill's past. In 1921, Royal Dutch Shell Oil Company hit the first oil gusher on Signal Hill, announcing the discovery of a massive oil field. This set off a major oil boom throughout the 1920's, as oil companies flocked to Signal Hill. In a short time, hundreds of derricks dotted the landscape, generating hundreds of thousands of gallons of oil per day. In April 1924, the City of Signal Hill was officially incorporated, electing California's first female mayor, Mrs. Jessie Nelson. Over the years, the oil derricks gradually disappeared, as homes and businesses took their place. Today, Signal Hill is a thriving community with a diverse population and economy.



MOTHER'S MARKET GRAND OPENING

Mother's Market & Kitchen opened a new organic grocery store at 2475 Cherry Avenue. This is Mother's first store outside of Orange County, where the chain was founded back in 1978.

REFURBISHED PUBLIC ART

The window panels and mister tower at Hilltop Park were repaired and renovated.

LIBRARY GROUNDBREAKING

In early 2018, we kicked off construction of Signal Hill's brand-new Public Library. Completion is scheduled for summer 2019!

ADOPTED A BALANCED BUDGET

The City adopted a structurally balanced budget for Fiscal Year 2018-2019.



HOUNDS ON THE HILL

Dogs and their owners roamed Signal Hill Park to enjoy pet-friendly games, crafts, vendors and more. Both dogs and cats were available for adoption, and the event offered low-cost pet vaccinations, dog licensing and microchipping.

PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT MEASURE M (March) OR MEASURE N (November)

In November of 2017, the City of Signal Hill took the first step in complying with SB 415 (the California Voter Participation Rights Act) by adopting a plan to move its current General Municipal Election date to a statewide election date of either March or November of even-numbered years by the November 8, 2022 Statewide General Election. The next step is to amend the City Charter based on voter preferences.

The ballot of the March 5, 2019 General Municipal Election will include a proposed amendment to the City Charter in the form of two ballot measures to either amend the City Charter to change the General Municipal Election date to the Statewide Primary Election date in March of even-numbered years (Measure M) or to change the General Municipal Election date to the Statewide General Election date in November of even-numbered years (Measure N).

Signal Hill voters will vote yes or no on the following measures:

Measure M:

Shall the measure, amending the City Charter to change the City's General Municipal Election date to the Statewide Primary

Election date of the first Tuesday after the first Monday in March of even-numbered years (from current date of the first Tuesday after the first Monday in March of odd-numbered years), commencing on March 8, 2022, and as a consequence extending one-time councilmember terms by one year, be adopted?

Measure N:

Shall the measure, amending the City Charter to change the City's General Municipal Election date to the Statewide General Election date of the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of even numbered years (from current date of the first Tuesday after the first Monday in March of odd-numbered years), commencing on November 3, 2020, and as a consequence reducing one-time councilmember terms by four months, be adopted?

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS UPDATE



NEW AND IMPROVED CALBRISAS PARK NOW OPEN!

The Community Services and Public Works Departments have been hard at work overseeing the upgrades. Visitors will now enjoy a new ADA-accessible rubberized play surface as well as new playground equipment. We hope you'll enjoy the new features.



NEW EV CHARGING STATIONS

New ChargePoint electric vehicle (EV) charging stations are now available for public use in the upper Civic Center parking lot on Legion Drive, across from City Hall. Charging fees are \$0.55/kWh. Once your vehicle is fully charged, you will have a 30-minute grace period to move your vehicle. After expiration of the grace period, a \$2.50 hourly parking fee will be charged. The ChargePoint mobile app is your key to managing and paying for your charging sessions. The stations are possible thanks to funding from the Clean Transportation grant from AQMD's Mobile Source Air Pollution Reduction Review Committee (MSRC). Additional charging stations will be available at the new Library. We encourage EV drivers and owners to take advantage of this new resource!



MORE THAN 1,000 CITY STREETLIGHTS UPGRADED TO LED

New LED streetlights are now brightening up the streets of Signal Hill! At the end of 2018, approximately 1,150 streetlights in the City were upgraded to energy-efficient LED lighting through a partnership with Southern California Edison. These new lights are brighter, use considerably less energy, and reduce greenhouse gas emissions.



Signal Hill's future public library has made a lot of progress over the last few months. Crews have completed the storm drain retention system, installed interior wood framing on both floors, installed 2nd floor roofing, continued plumbing/HVAC/electrical installations, began site grading for the parking lot, and constructed exterior retaining walls. ORGANIC WASTE RECYCLING

As part of the fight against climate change, California is working to reduce organic waste in landfills. Decomposing organic waste is a major generator of greenhouse gases. SB 1383, the Short-Lived Climate Pollutants Act, requires a 50% reduction in the level of statewide disposal of organic waste by 2020 and a 75% reduction by 2025.

We can all do our part to reduce the amount of organic waste that ends up in landfills. Food waste alone accounts for approximately 18% of total landfill disposal. Consider composting in your own backyard, reducing the amount of food you throw away, and donating unwanted edible food to a local food bank or food program.

As a reminder, effective January 1, 2019, commercial businesses and multi-family dwelling units of 5 or more that generate 4 cubic yards or more of trash per week must arrange for organic waste collection services. Contact EDCO at 562-597-0608 to get started.


LA-HOP: ASSISTING PEOPLE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS IN LA COUNTY

Throughout California, communities are working to offer services and resources to those experiencing homelessness.

Our officers are partnering with regional agencies including the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority and the Los Angeles County Department of Mental Health. Outreach teams work to identify those in need and connect them with housing, medical, and mental health services.

The newest outreach tool, available to all members of the community, is the online Los Angeles County Homeless Outreach Portal (LA-HOP). If you are concerned about a homeless neighbor, and they are not in immediate danger, causing danger to others, or committing a crime, you may submit an outreach request via LA-HOP. USING DESIGNATED SCHOOL DROP-OFF ZONES

When dropping children off at school or picking them up, please note that when you are merging back into traffic from the designated drop-off zones, you must yield the right-of-way to regular traffic. Whenever you enter traffic, signal and be sure you have enough room to safely enter the lane. Your vehicle does not have the right-of-way leaving the drop-off zone. The SHPD Traffic Bureau will be on hand as much as possible to monitor school pickups and drop offs, and will enforce right-of-way rules.

The program provides subsidized monthly bus passes for Long Beach Transit buses or Dial-A-Taxi voucher books for Yellow Cab service.
