The new Signal Hill Public Library is now open! On August 10, we cut the ribbon on the new facility, kicking off years to come of reading, learning and community gathering. ABOUT THE NEW LIBRARY

The brand-new, 14,000 square-foot facility is more than a public Library. It is also a valued and inclusive gathering space, a technology resource for everyone, and a place to allow patrons of all ages to enjoy reading and recreation together. The new Signal Hill Public Library is located at 1800 E. Hill Street, adjacent to City Hall.

The Library features a large Community Room for events, technology learning labs, a teen gathering space, a large children's area featuring Daisy the Dinosaur, reservable conference rooms, a history room with rotating exhibits, and a rooftop terrace with sweeping views of the area. VOTING IS CHANGING IN 2020



The voting experience is changing for the better in Los Angeles County! In March 2020, County election officials will be implementing Voting Solutions for All People, a new voting system designed to make voting easier and more convenient for everyone. Visit <http://vsap.lavote.net> for more information.

Changes will include:

Extended Time to Vote: You will be able to start voting ten days prior to Election Day. Voters will no longer be restricted to one day of in-person voting.

Vote Centers: You will be able to cast your ballot at any one of 1,000 Voting Centers located throughout the County. You will no longer have a single polling place.

Mock Election: September 28 – 29

Try out the new voting experience! On September 28-29, the Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk will be conducting a mock election event that will allow the public the opportunity to interact with all the new components to the VSAP experience. There will be up to 50 mock vote centers spread throughout the County. Please visit lavote.net for additional information.

New Ballot Marking Technology: New Ballot Marking Devices allow for an accessible voting experience for everyone; with multiple languages, audio ballot readings, accessible screen settings, and more.

Interactive Sample Ballot: The interactive sample ballot allows voters to electronically record their sample ballot selections on their own computer or mobile device. They can then generate a QR code called the Poll Pass. Voters then take their Poll Pass to any vote center within the County and scan it at the ballot. The Ballot Marking Device will then generate all the previous selections from the Interactive Sample Ballot and provide the voter another chance to make any changes before submitting.

Electronic Voter Registration Verification: Electronic Pollbooks verify the registration eligibility of any County voter, allowing you to vote at any vote center. Additionally, voters will be able to register to vote and update their registration in-person at any vote center.

Vote by Mail: The new Vote by Mail materials are easy to read, easy to understand, easy to complete and, in addition, voters are no longer required to attach postage to their return envelope. Voters who prefer to drop off their ballot in-person can do so at any vote center or drop-off location in the County.

BE READY FOR A DISASTER: MAP YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD

Neighborhoods that are prepared for emergencies can save lives, reduce the severity of injuries and trauma, and reduce property damage.

To help coordinate neighborhood efforts, Signal Hill utilizes the Map Your Neighborhood program. MYN teaches neighbors to rely on each other before emergency responders arrive. You'll map out potential hazards (like gas meters and water valves), neighbors who will need extra assistance during a crisis, and neighbors who have valuable skills or resources. Your team of

neighbors will then use this information to organize and create a disaster response plan, giving you the confidence to think clearly and quickly during a crisis.

MYN training is designed to be delivered to residents by residents. Interested residents receive training from the Signal Hill Emergency Operations Coordinator, then train their neighbors on disaster preparation, response, and recovery. Do You Know How to Turn Off Utilities in an Emergency?

GAS METER: Only shut off your gas if you smell or hear gas leaking. Signs include a "rotten egg" odor, hissing sounds, or if you see the gas meter spinning rapidly. DO NOT light a match, start an engine, use a cell phone, turn on or off a light switch or do anything that may create a spark. Consider keeping a turn-off wrench tied to your gas meter so you or your neighbors have the right tool handy in a disaster. Never turn gas back on once it has been turned off, your gas utility must come out to turn it back on.

WATER VALVE: Water is a precious resource following a disaster, so you'll want to shut it off during an emergency. It can also help to keep contaminants from polluting the water supply and to prevent gravity from draining your

water heater and toilet tanks. Make sure you know where the master shut-off water valve is, and what tools you need to open and close it. It's a good idea to label the valve so everyone knows where it is.

ELECTRICITY: Every responsible member of your household should know where your electrical service panel or circuit panel is located. The panel may be in the garage or basement. It may be on the outside of the house near your electric meter. In an apartment or condo, it may be recessed into the wall in a closet or laundry area. To shut off the electricity to your home, turn off individual breakers first, then the main breaker lever. Never operate electrical switches if you suspect a gas leak.

EDCO's Free Bulky Item Pickup Week is November 4 - 8! Place your bulky items out on the curb on your regularly scheduled collection day that week, or drop them off at EDCO at 2755 California Avenue. If you are in a multi-family building, please call EDCO no later than the week of October 28 to schedule your free pickup.

EDCO residential customers can also schedule a free bulky item pickup up to two times a year, up to four items per scheduled collection. You must contact EDCO ahead of time at 562-597-0608 to schedule the service.



DON'T TRASH BATTERIES, CELL PHONES AND OTHER ELECTRONIC WASTE

.....

Lithium Ion (Li-Ion) batteries are commonly found in cell phones, laptops, cordless phones, house electronics or power tools. These batteries are considered hazardous waste and when they can potentially explode and cause fires in collection carts, trucks, or disposal facilities. The state of California blamed exploding batteries for 65 percent of fires at its waste facilities in 2017.

All batteries and electronic waste must be properly recycled or taken to a household hazardous waste disposal facility, and NEVER placed in trash or recycling carts!

Electronic waste and Li-Ion batteries can be properly disposed of for free at EDCO's Environmental Collection Center, 2755 California Avenue, open the second and fourth Saturday of each month from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Standard dry-cell (alkaline) batteries contain heavy metals such as mercury, lead, cadmium, and nickel, which can contaminate the environment when batteries are improperly disposed of. You can safely recycle household alkaline and other dry-cell batteries at the following locations:

- Signal Hill Public Library, 1800 E. Hill Street
- Signal Hill City Yard, 2175 E. 28th Street

GREEN SCENE

The City of Signal Hill is committed to sustainability: striking a balance between economic growth, social responsibility, and environmental well-being by partnering with our neighbors, businesses, and the community to provide a healthy and enduring environment for future generations.

In recent years, the City has completed several green initiatives that demonstrate our commitment to sustainability and environmentally sound practices in Signal Hill.

TRAFFIC SIGNALS LED UPGRADE PROJECT

Installed new energy-efficient LED safety light fixtures at various signalized intersections throughout Signal Hill, thanks to a partnership with Southern California Edison.

STREETLIGHT LED UPGRADE

Upgraded all public streetlights (approximately 1,150 lights) to LED, thanks to a partnership with Southern California Edison.

ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATIONS

Installed three public EV charging stations at the Civic Center – two in the upper City Hall parking lot, one at the new Public Library.

SOLAR ENERGY GENERATION

Installed 198 solar panels at the new Library, capable of generating up to 68KwH of power.

Installed a solar carport structure at the Police Station, capable of generating up to 55KwH power, offsetting approximately 33% of the Station's electrical usage.

Streamlined the permitting process for small residential rooftop solar systems, resulting in 112 residential permits issued to-date.

WATER CONSERVATION

Replaced four older pump motors with high efficiency motors at the Gundry and Hilltop Pump Stations using federal grant monies.

Installed irrigation retrofits at seven City parks and facilities, including nozzles, spray heads, controllers, low-flow toilets, water efficient faucets, and tree mulch rings at no cost.

SMART WATER METERS

Replaced 260 aging residential water meters with "smart" meters. Smart meters electronically collect and transmit water usage data allowing customers to monitor and adjust water usage.

GREEN WASTE

Purchased park playground equipment and surfacing made with recycled plastic and repaved roads with recycled rubber shavings.

Used mulching mowers to eliminate green waste and shredded tree trimmings into mulch.

CHARGE YOUR ELECTRIC VEHICLE AT ONE OF OUR PUBLIC CHARGING STATIONS

WHEN CAN I WATER MY LAWN?

The City of Signal Hill is under a Level 1 Water Shortage. Watering and irrigation is allowed Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday only. Watering or irrigation is prohibited between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Watering or irrigation of any lawn or landscape is limited to 15 minutes per day, per station. Washing down hard or paved surfaces is prohibited except when necessary to alleviate safety or sanitary hazards. Please also remember that using water to wash or clean a vehicle is prohibited except by use of a hand-held bucket or similar container, or a hand-held hose equipped with a positive self-closing water shutoff nozzle or device.

ANIMAL CARE SERVICES

All dogs four months and older are required to have a current dog license per the City's municipal code (SHMC 6.08.010). A permanent dog license tag is issued when a license is first purchased (there is a \$5 fee for replacement tags). Licenses may be purchased at the Community Services Department. Owners must provide a current rabies inoculation certificate (must be good for the entire licensing period) and a certificate of sterility if the dog has been spayed or neutered. The fees are \$95 unaltered, \$20 altered, and \$25 late fee. Seniors (age 60+) receive a discounted rate of \$10. This discount is for one altered dog per household only; all others are at regular rates.
