

LOCAL MEASURES AND ELECTIONS

The Signal Hill General Municipal Election will be held on **Tuesday, November 3, 2020** to elect three members of the City Council. There are four candidates who qualified for this election:

- ★ Robert D. Copeland
- ★ Terry Rogers
- ★ Edward "Ed" H.J. Wilson
- ★ Lori Y. Woods

The **Signal Hill Financial Stability Measure (Measure R)** will also be on the ballot:

Shall a measure establishing a $\frac{3}{4}$ (three-quarter) cent sales tax providing an estimated \$5,000,000 annually to the City's general fund to maintain city programs such as: street, pothole, and infrastructure repair, clean public areas, 9-1-1 emergency response, crime prevention, and other general services until ended by voters, with independent audits, all money used locally for Signal Hill, be adopted?



ELECTION 2020

VOTE BY MAIL

All registered voters will be mailed a Vote by Mail ballot to ensure a safe and accessible voting option during the COVID-19 pandemic. Vote by Mail ballots will be mailed to all voters starting Monday, October 5. Return your ballot as early as possible to ensure it is received on time.

How do I return my ballot?

- ★ By mail, no postage needed
- ★ In-person at any Vote by Mail drop box location
- ★ At any Vote Center in L.A. County

Vote by Mail Ballots must be received via mail no later than three days after Election Day. If you drop it off, you must do so before 8:00 p.m. at a Vote Center on Election Day, November 3.

DROP BOXES

There will be hundreds of safe and secure drop boxes beginning October 5, including one at the Signal Hill Public Library.

TRACK YOUR VOTE BY MAIL BALLOT

You can sign up to track the status of your Vote by Mail ballot at WheresMyBallot.sos.ca.gov. You'll receive automatic e-mail, text, or voice call notifications about your ballot - when it is mailed, received, and counted.

IN-PERSON VOTING

Election Day is Tuesday, November 3. Vote Centers open at 7:00 a.m. and close at 8:00 p.m. Vote Center locations will be posted on the City website and at lavote.net as they become available. Remember, you no longer must vote at a designated polling place. L.A. County voters can vote at any official Vote Center in the County. Save time at the polls by putting together a sample ballot before heading out. Visit isb.lavote.net to get started.

HOW TO CHECK IF YOUR BALLOT WAS RECEIVED AND COUNTED

Check the status of your ballot to confirm if it was received and tallied online, at lavote.net/av_inquiry.

ARE YOU REGISTERED TO VOTE?

To be eligible to vote in the November 3 election, you must register no later than Monday, October 19, 2020. Check your registration status, update your voter information, and register at lavote.net.

USPS RECOMMENDATION

Return your ballot early!

If your ballot is postmarked by Election Day and received within 17 days your ballot will be accepted.

MEASURE R IS ON YOUR LOCAL SIGNAL HILL BALLOT – PLEASE PARTICIPATE!

This year, Signal Hill voters will have an opportunity to vote locally on City Council Members and Measure R – the City of Signal Hill Financial Stability Measure.

If approved by Signal Hill voters, Measure R would enact a $\frac{3}{4}$ cent local sales tax to address local needs, including preparing for future public health emergencies or natural disasters, helping local residents and businesses recover, and addressing basic repairs and maintenance needs to public facilities, storm drains, streets, and sidewalks.

COVID-19

As we continue to fight the COVID-19 pandemic, it is important to stay informed and up-to-date. We are learning more about COVID-19 every day, and information changes quickly. Be sure you are getting COVID-19 information from trusted sources.

COVID-19 can easily spread to others from an infected person through the following:

- Droplets from talking, coughing, and sneezing
- Close personal contact
- Touching an object or surface with the virus on it, then touching your mouth, nose, or eyes before washing your hands
- Many people can have COVID-19 without showing any symptoms. These people can still spread the virus to others.

WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19?

Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus, and include:



Fever or Chills



Muscle or Body Aches



Cough



Headache



Difficulty Breathing



New Loss of Taste or Smell



Fatigue



Sore Throat

SLOWING THE SPREAD: HOW TO PROTECT YOURSELF, YOUR FAMILY, AND THE COMMUNITY

Asymptomatic people with COVID-19 can be contagious, spreading the illness without even knowing it. As we wait for a vaccine and treatments for COVID-19, it's up to all of us to protect ourselves and others from this new disease. Together, we can slow the spread.

The best defenses against COVID-19 are to stay apart from people you don't live with, stay home as much as possible, wear a face covering outside of the home, wash your hands often, and avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth.

FACE COVERINGS

Wearing a face covering or mask that covers both the mouth and nose can protect others from droplets that come out when we talk, sneeze or cough.




As of press time, most people in California are legally required to wear a mask or face covering when outside the home. Face coverings are especially important when indoors or in public places where others are present. Children under the age of 2 (including infants) should not wear face coverings.

PHYSICAL DISTANCING

Physical or social distancing means staying home as much as you can, avoiding crowds, and keeping at least 6 feet away from others whenever possible. When someone with COVID-19 talks, coughs, or sneezes, the small droplets from their nose or mouth can travel up to 6 feet. You can get infected if you breathe in these droplets, or the droplets land on your eyes, nose, or mouth. This is why it is important to keep at least a 6-foot distance from others, especially indoors or in public places.



AVOID GATHERING WITH PEOPLE YOU DON'T LIVE WITH

Parties, gatherings, and groups of people from multiple households are an easy way to spread COVID-19. They are legally prohibited by County Public Health as of press time. Avoid close contact with people who don't live in your household. Please do not host or attend gatherings during the pandemic. Instead, consider a virtual gathering, phone call, text, or other non-physical way to connect with loved ones.

WASH YOUR HANDS FREQUENTLY

It may be possible that a person can get COVID-19 by touching a surface or object that has the virus on it and then touching their own mouth, nose, or eyes. Therefore, wash your hands as much as possible with warm running water and soap for at least 20 seconds.

GET YOUR FLU SHOT

Please get a flu shot this year. While it won't provide immunity against COVID-19, reducing your risk of getting the flu will help avoid overwhelming our health care system this flu season.

COVID-19 IMPACTS

The City of Signal Hill is under the jurisdiction of the L.A. County Department of Public Health. All residents and businesses in the city must follow L.A. County Public Health orders and guidance.

The COVID-19 pandemic is a fluid situation. L.A. County Public Health Officer Orders are your guide to current business openings and closures, re-opening protocols, and public health guidance for everyone that will slow the spread of COVID-19. CITY HALL OPEN BY APPOINTMENT ONLY

As of press time, Signal Hill City Hall and the Community Services Department are open by appointment only. No walk-ins will be allowed inside City facilities. For the safety of City staff and the community, we encourage business to be conducted by phone or e-mail. CITY HALL CLOSED ON FRIDAYS THROUGH DECEMBER

Signal Hill City Hall and the Signal Hill City Yard will be closed every Friday from September 2020 – December 2020. These closures are due to furloughs of City employees, intended to help balance the City budget.



RESTAURANT OUTDOOR DINING PLANS

We encourage residents to support local businesses and enjoy a safe outdoor dining experience while abiding by L.A. County Public Health guidelines. To assist, the City is allowing current restaurants with existing business licenses to create approved temporary outdoor dining areas. Businesses must provide a modest site plan, proposed health and social distancing measures, and other necessary information. RACE AND EQUITY FRAMEWORK



The City of Signal Hill seeks to identify, understand, and address current issues surrounding racial justice, systemic inequities, and structural racism within our community. The City of Signal Hill seeks to engage the community and dialogue on various aspects of race and equity as part of an evolving effort to address systemic racism and bias in the policies and practices of municipal government.

STANDING UP FOR EQUALITY AND AGAINST SYSTEMIC RACISM

During the July 14, 2020 City Council meeting, the Signal Hill City Council unanimously adopted a formal resolution titled Standing Up for Equality and Against Systemic Racism.

KEY POINTS OF THE RESOLUTION INCLUDE:

- Signal Hill affirms its commitment to foster a culture in which ALL members of the community feel safe, respected and valued; are invited to participate fully, sharing their unique gifts, talents and backgrounds; increasingly recognize the value of perspectives that differ from their own; and understand that diversity and inclusion are key priorities of the City's success.
- The City Council calls upon all elected, appointed, and administrative staff, and the residents and business community, to come together to identify, assess, revise, and eliminate areas that promote or uphold systemic racism.

- The City will create a Diversity Coalition Committee to examine current policies in city policing, city operations, and city-related events.

DIVERSITY COALITION COMMITTEE

The Diversity Coalition Committee (DCC) will facilitate a better understanding of diversity, assist the City in eliminating and preventing discrimination, hate and bias; and provide recommendations to City Council that address issues of diversity and create a more equitable, safe, welcoming and inclusive government and community. THE OBAMA FOUNDATION MAYOR'S PLEDGE

Signal Hill Mayor Robert D. Copeland, with the support of the Signal Hill City Council, signed the Obama Foundation Mayor's Pledge. The pledge calls on local mayors to commit to the following actions:

1. Review police use of force policies.
2. Engage communities by including a diverse range of input, experiences, and stories in your review.
3. Report the findings of your review to your community and seek feedback.
4. Reform the community's police use of force policies.

COVID-19 AND WATER



Business owners and building managers: if your facility has been closed for an extended period, the Signal Hill Water Department recommends checking your property for water leaks or running toilets. You can also call Water Customer Service at 562-989-7315 to have your water service turned off if your facility is closed/vacant due to COVID-19. Upon re-opening, you may need to flush your water system and perform other recommended tasks. If you have questions, please call the Signal Hill Water Department at 562-989-7250.



CHARGE YOUR ELECTRIC VEHICLE IN SIGNAL HILL

Signal Hill is a great place to own an electric vehicle (EV). We are proud to offer three public ChargePoint charging stations for EV drivers. One charging station is located at the Signal Hill Public Library, 1800 E. Hill Street. Two stations are located at the upper Civic Center parking lot on Legion Drive just north of Hill Street. Each charging station can charge two vehicles at the same time. Charging fees are \$0.55/kWh, and you can pay from your smartphone. TAKE ACTION AGAINST MOSQUITOES

Mosquito bites can transmit viruses like West Nile Virus and others to humans. Fight the bite, and help reduce the threat of mosquitoes in Signal Hill.

REDUCING MOSQUITO POPULATIONS

Reduce mosquito population growth by eliminating sources of standing water from outside the home. Take the Tip, Toss and Take Action Pledge: TIP out any standing water, TOSS out any container that can collect water, and TAKE ACTION by sharing mosquito prevention tips with others.

- Eliminate standing water in clogged rain gutters, rain barrels, discarded tires, buckets, or anything that holds water for more than a week.
- Maintain swimming pools, spas, and ponds.
- Change the water in pet dishes, birdbaths, and other small containers weekly.
- Report green swimming pools to the Greater L.A. County Vector Control District: 562-944-9656.

PREVENT MOSQUITO BITES

Wear insect repellent when outdoors where mosquitoes may be present. Use repellent containing the following CDC and EPA approved ingredients:

- DEET®
- Picaridin
- IR3535
- Oil of lemon eucalyptus

Wear light-colored, long-sleeved shirts and long pants. Close or repair all unscreened doors and windows to prevent mosquitoes from entering your home.

EDCO'S FREE BULKY ITEM PICKUP

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

EDCO's Household Hazardous and Electronic Waste Collections are held on the second and fourth Saturday of each month, from 9 a.m. – 2 p.m., with new COVID-19 safety precautions. Everyone must wear a face covering and remain in their vehicles with windows closed. Staff will only remove household hazardous and electronic waste from your trunk or truck bed. Staff will not dispose of sharps, you must self-dispose at the facility.

Household Hazardous Waste are products containing toxic chemicals used around the home. Products labeled Caution, Danger, Poison, Toxic, Flammable, or Corrosive are considered hazardous. E-waste includes lithium-ion batteries, old computers, monitors, televisions, etc. These items should not be placed in your trash bin.
