THE FUTURE OF SIGNAL HILL PARKS: PARKS & RECREATION MASTER PLAN

The City recently completed a lengthy parks and recreation master planning process. The resulting Parks and Recreation Master Plan provides an overview of the community's needs, attitudes, interests, and priorities. This plan will guide the City's efforts to develop and improve its programs, parks and facilities over the next 10 years.

Work on the Master Plan goes back several years and incorporates previous planning documents. A project team that included consultants, City staff and elected and appointed officials guided our recent efforts. The community was involved in a variety of public meetings, focus groups, and multiple community surveys. Just this March, we held a virtual Community Input session.

The Plan created a variety of goals and recommendations to enhance the level of service and the quality of life through improved parks, facilities and amenities, dedication to affordability and accessibility of services and programs, improved programming and service delivery, organizational efficiencies, and increased financial opportunities.

We encourage you to visit cityofsignalhill.org to review the entire Parks and Recreation Master Plan.

Our next steps will focus on the Prioritization and Implementation Plan (PIP). This supplemental plan will

include a more detailed look at each goal and estimate the necessary resources. Both the PIP and the Master Plan will be incorporated into the Environmental Resources Element of a future General Plan Amendment, which will be presented to the City Council after review by the Parks and Recreation Commission. We hope you will get involved in shaping the future of our City's parks and recreation programs and amenities! Please stay tuned to our Facebook page and our website for updates and future opportunities for involvement.

Highlights of the Plan's Goals and Recommendations

- Develop additional recreational facilities, playgrounds, parking, and amenities.
- Explore improving and adding trail and pathway connectivity, and open space/natural area preservation.
- Develop a replacement schedule for equipment, parks, facilities, trails, pathways, and identify priorities of future maintenance projects for these areas.
- Explore opportunities to increase youth, senior and family programs, activities, and services.
- Continue to improve organizational efficiencies.
- Focus on accessibility and affordability for all.

COMMEMORATIVE FLAGS IN 2021

Since 2019, the City has adopted a commemorative flag policy to allow for the rotating display of commemorative flags underneath the City flag at City Hall, the Public Library, and the Police Station.

Here are the commemorative flags we have raised so far in 2021:



FEBRUARY: The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) Flag

This past February, the NAACP Long Beach Branch flag flew at City Hall to commemorate Black History Month. Each February, we celebrate the history and achievements of African-Americans and honor the generations of Black Americans who struggled with adversity throughout American history.



MARCH: Healthcare Heroes Flag

In March, we honored all healthcare workers who work vigorously in the face of COVID-19. We recognize their courage and dedication during one of the most challenging health crises in our country's history. We also honor those healthcare workers who unfortunately lost their lives due to COVID-19 while treating others. We reflect on their loss and the loved ones they leave behind, as we continue our efforts to fight COVID-19.



APRIL: Cambodian Genocide Remembrance

We raise the Cambodian flag through April in commemoration of Cambodian Genocide Remembrance Day, April 17. This day remembers the genocide of over two million Cambodians from 1975 to 1979 during the Khmer Rouge Regime. We remember those lives lost and celebrate the resilience of the Cambodian community.

A MESSAGE FROM THE DIVERSITY COALITION COMMITTEE

The Diversity Coalition Committee (DCC) was formed in late 2020 when the City approved the Racial Equity Framework, found on our website, which serves as a “call to action” to address institutional racism and implicit bias in our community.

We are Signal Hill residents that have come forward with a personal commitment to take an active role in civic affairs.

The initial task of the DCC is to work together to develop an actionable plan from the guiding principles of the Racial Equity Framework. The channels through which the plan will come to fruition are: facilitating community engagement, providing education regarding the community’s diversity, and identifying opportunities for continuous improvement.

The action plan that the DCC produces will remain fluid and responsive to the needs of Signal Hill. There is no singular objective or goal. We expect the work of the DCC to carry on as long as there is support from the City, interest from the volunteers, and positive feedback from the community.

A critical prerequisite for the DCC’s success is establishing strong communication links with the broader Signal Hill community. All residents are welcome to attend our regular meetings.

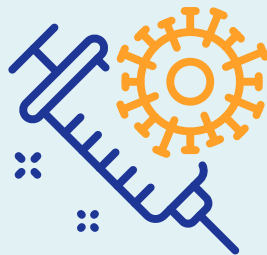

COVID-19 VACCINES

COVID-19 vaccination is an important tool to help us get back to normal. All available vaccines are effective at keeping you from getting COVID-19. A vaccine may also help protect you from serious illness even if you do get COVID-19. The vaccine is being distributed in phases based on age. In most cases, appointments are required due to limited supply.

CONTINUE TO SLOW THE SPREAD

We are making progress in the fight against COVID-19. However, the virus and its new variants remain a threat. Our region could easily see another rise in cases, resulting in new closures and restrictions, if we let our guard down too early. Even if you have been vaccinated, please continue practicing the healthy habits that slow the spread of COVID-19.

• WEAR A MASK



Everyone over two years old, who is medically able, should wear a mask whenever you are away from home and around people who don't live with you.

Wear your mask over your nose and mouth and secure it under your chin. It should fit snugly against the sides of your face.

Health officials encourage “double-masking” for extra protection. A close-fitting cloth mask can be worn on top of a surgical/disposable mask to improve the seal of the mask to the face. Do not wear more than two masks or double up on KN-95 masks or masks with filters.

• AVOID CROWDS



Stay at least 6 feet (about 2 arm lengths) from others who don't live with you.

Avoid crowds.

The more people you are in contact with, the more likely you are to be exposed to COVID-19.

• WASH YOUR HANDS

Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water is unavailable, you can use a hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.

EDCO Spring Bulky Item Pick-Up Week: May 3 – May 7

Declutter and get rid of bulky items for free during EDCO Disposal's free Bulky Item Pickup Week. Bulky items include any household goods, such as washers and dryers, furniture, mattresses (must be wrapped), and other large non-hazardous items. If you live in a single-family household, you can dispose of unwanted bulky items by placing them at the curb by 6 a.m. on your normal trash day the week of May 3 – May 7. Please affix a bulky item tag on each item (below). You can find additional printable tags at edcodisposal.com. Residents in multi-family complexes or an HOA must work with your HOA or building manager and EDCO to arrange for your free pick-up, prior to May 3. from 6:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. Please be sure you are following current L.A. County Public Health protocols when attending the Shredding Event.

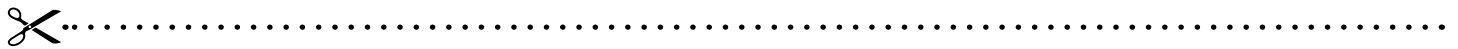


CIVIC SPARK EARTH DAY VIRTUAL CLEAN-UP EVENT: SATURDAY, APRIL 24

Reducing Landfill Waste and Pollution

SB 1383 TO IMPACT WASTE REMOVAL AND RECYCLING

SB 1383’s ultimate goal is to eventually redirect and recover 75% of organic material that would previously have gone to the landfill. SB 1383 is intended to keep more organic material out of our landfills. This is part of the state’s fight against climate change, as organic waste in landfills is a major generator of destructive greenhouse gases. The methane produced by organic materials in landfills produce 80 times more greenhouse gas emissions than carbon dioxide.

SB 1383’s ultimate goal is to eventually redirect and recover 75% of organic material that would previously gone to the landfill. To get there, all commercial and residential households will need to be sure they are taking steps to properly recycle

organic waste. Local cities, counties and other jurisdictions must also adopt new ordinances to ensure that all residential and commercial waste generators are in compliance. Therefore, Signal Hill is in the process of amending municipal codes and adopting inspection and enforcement programs to be in compliance with SB 1383 regulations by 2022. Please be aware that recycling and waste removal fees may be impacted by these regulations. We will keep residents informed of updates as they become available.

HOUSING ELEMENT UPDATE

Every city in California is required to have a Housing Element to outline how it can meet its housing needs across multiple income levels. The Housing Element is updated every eight years, when the State calculates the number of housing units each city and county will need for the next eight years. The resulting number is called the Regional Housing Needs Assessment (RHNA). Cities are obligated to identify and adopt appropriate zoning to accommodate the required number of housing units. According to the Southern California News Group’s Annual Housing Permit Report, released in January 2021, the City received an A rating for its 2019 progress in meeting its housing goals.

Signal Hill is finishing its 5th Cycle and preparing for the 6th Cycle. Signal Hill’s RHNA for the 5th Cycle was 169 residential units. The allocation for the 6th Cycle is more than three times that number, at 517 units. As we prepare for this challenging next cycle, we will strive to meet our allocated goals. TEMPLE AVENUE ENHANCEMENT AND RE-PAVEMENT COMPLETED

In a continued effort to maintain and improve the public infrastructure, the Public Works Department joined forces with the City of Long Beach to enhance and re-pave Temple Avenue. The project was successfully completed in February 2021 and delivers the following: re-constructed ADA concrete curb ramps, new bike lanes, new rubberized asphalt, and thermoplastic striping.

SUMMERLAND RESIDENTIAL PHASE 1

The Summerland project will create 16 two-story detached single-family homes on E. 23rd Street. Phase I, the first eight homes, are currently under construction. Phase II, the remaining eight homes, will begin upon completion of Phase I.



TARGET COMMERCIAL CENTER AND SELF-STORAGE FACILITY: 950 E. 33RD STREET AND CALIFORNIA AVENUE AT E. 33RD STREET

This project includes a remodel of the existing Target store, a new self-storage facility, and three new commercial pads totaling 23,500 square feet. Site preparation is currently underway. 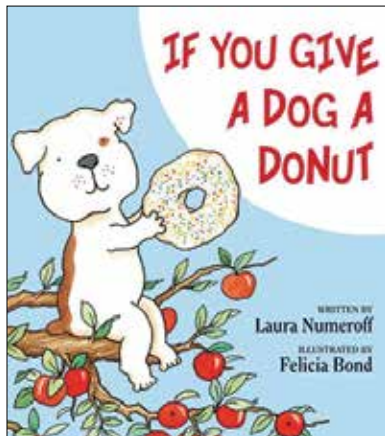
