



They also strongly reduce the chance of hospitalization and death. The more people get vaccinated, the less likely it is that COVID-19 will spread or that new variants of the virus will take hold. Getting vaccinated can save your life and the lives of others. Even people who have had COVID-19 should get vaccinated because their natural immunity may not last long enough or be strong enough, and they could get infected again.



HOW TO GET VACCINATED

Vaccinations are free and available to all Californians 12 years old and up, regardless of immigration status. Most major pharmacies offer the vaccine. You can also contact your doctor or health care provider.

L.A. County and the City of Long Beach also offer free vaccine clinics throughout the area. You could even win prizes or gift cards for getting vaccinated. MASK UPDATE

Masks are required for everyone while in indoor public places, regardless of vaccination status. This applies to places such as indoor venues, gatherings, and businesses. Masks are also required at large outdoor events that draw 10,000 people or more; including concerts and sporting events. Exceptions apply for children under the age of two, for those with certain medical conditions or disabilities that prevent masking, and for those whose jobs don't permit masking. This requirement applies throughout L.A. County, including Signal Hill. Please wear a mask that covers both the nose and mouth and securely fits around the chin and face.

GET VACCINATED

COVID-19 vaccines are extremely effective at protecting you from getting COVID-19 or getting severely ill from COVID-19.

THANK YOU, SIGNAL HILL!

As of August 19, 2021, more than 74% of Signal Hill residents aged 12 and older have received at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine. Signal Hill has a higher vaccination rate compared to other parts of L.A. County among residents 12 and older. Thank you for doing your part to help end the pandemic by getting your vaccine. Please encourage your friends and family to get vaccinated if they haven't already. As we head into a new school year, it is especially important that children over 12 get vaccinated. The more people that get vaccinated, the closer we can get to ending the COVID-19 pandemic.



TARGET REIMAGINED AND GATEWAY CENTER NORTH

Signal Hill's Target store, located at 950 E. 33rd Street, will be undergoing a transformation! Plans are in the works for a remodel of the interior and exterior of the store. New additions to the interior will include an Ulta Beauty section and an adult beverage section. Exterior improvements include a steel tower element that measures 53 feet high, reminiscent of an oil derrick. Please stay tuned for updates on this exciting project.

While we plan Phase I, we will look forward to Phases II and III of the newly reimagined Gateway Center North. Phase II is the development of Secure Space Self-Storage which will include three stories plus outdoor storage for boats and RVs. Phase III is the development of two new commercial pads totaling 18,500 square feet for retail, food, or service uses and 5,000 square feet for a drive-thru restaurant.

VIEW PARK PROJECT UPDATE


Construction of Signal Hill's newest park is underway at the corner of E. Burnett Street and Cherry Avenue. The project is expected to be completed by Spring 2022. This park, originally named View Park, will provide a link to the City's existing trail system by connecting walkers from the Hilltop trails down towards the Civic Center. The park includes multiple seating areas for view opportunities, a landscaped trail for pedestrian access, and vehicular access for adjacent oil well operators. The park will also include a design element that showcases historical events and persons who have shaped Signal Hill.

WE NEED YOUR HELP! PLEASE CONTINUE TO CONSERVE WATER



The Signal Hill community has a strong track record of embracing water conservation and truly making a difference. With California experiencing its second consecutive dry year, coupled with the effects of climate change, drought planning and conservation must again become a priority in our daily lives. The City continues to meet water conservation goals, but this may be challenging in the near future as drier conditions persist. Please help us stay on track by doing the following:

Reduce watering of outdoor landscapes that causes runoff onto adjacent property, non-irrigated areas, private and public walkways, roadways, parking lots, or structures.

- Do not wash your vehicle with a hose, unless you are using a positive action shut-off nozzle.
- Track your water bill and meter to reduce water use.
- Turn off water when brushing teeth or shaving.
- Use dishwashers and washing machines with full loads only.
- Check your home for small leaks. Toilets, faucets and outdoor hoses are common leak sources.
- Consider installing drought-tolerant landscaping to reduce the need for outdoor watering.



NEW ORGANICS ORDINANCE: 3-CONTAINER COLLECTION SYSTEM

As part of the fight against climate change, California is working to reduce organic waste in landfills. Decomposing organic waste is a major generator of greenhouse gases. SB 1383, the Short-Lived Climate Pollutants Act, requires a 50% reduction in the level of statewide disposal of organic waste by 2020 and a 75% reduction by 2025.

Beginning this fall, all residents, businesses and multi-family dwellings will be required to join in the effort. Per State law, the City will adopt an Organics Ordinance that will implement a 3-container collection system for trash, recycling, and organics.

Please follow our website and social media for important updates regarding the new ordinance.

Organic waste is anything that decomposes naturally, including:

- ✓ Food scraps
- ✓ Dirty or soiled paper food containers
- ✓ Paper towels and tissues
- ✓ Plants and plant material
- ✓ Untreated wood

Once the app is downloaded, search for "Signal Hill". You can then either log in to your water billing account using existing credentials or register for the first time. BROUGHT TO YOU BY MEASURE R

Measure R, also known as the Signal Hill Financial Stability Measure, is a $\frac{1}{4}$ cent local sales tax measure approved by voters in the November 2020 General Election. The funding from Measure R will ensure our community is prepared for the future by investing in infrastructure, parks and outdoor spaces, public health, public safety, and other City services and amenities.

As these projects and programs get underway, you'll start seeing our new "Brought to You by Measure R" signs posted around the community. We look forward to kicking off these projects that will keep our community safe, clean and well-maintained.



CITY COUNCIL ADOPTS A BALANCED FISCAL YEAR 2021-22 BUDGET

On June 27, 2021, the City Council adopted the second year of a biennial operating budget for Fiscal Year 2021-22. The adopted budget will ensure our community has the financial foundation to continue to thrive and support the high quality of life enjoyed by Signal Hill residents and businesses. With an operating budget of \$27.9 million and a capital budget of \$10.6 million, the budget is balanced, includes healthy reserves, and invests in our community and our infrastructure. SURVEY RESULTS ARE IN FOR THE FUTURE OF HOUSING IN SIGNAL HILL

The City is in the final stages of completing its 6th Cycle Housing Element, required by California law to plan for and address housing needs for the community for all income levels.



As part of the City's outreach efforts, the public was invited to complete a housing survey to determine community needs. More than 140 responses have been recorded from residents who have lived in Signal Hill from less than five years to over 20 years. Of the total responses, 71% are homeowners. Over half of the respondents would like affordable housing to be available to service workers and public service workers like teachers, first responders, and police officers as well as professionals and office workers. When asked about new housing, nearly 50% think that proximity to amenities like grocery stores is important. When asked about where new housing should be located, the responses were split between repurposing office and commercial sites to residential uses and repurposing office and commercial sites to accommodate mixed uses and repurposing former oil property.

Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete the Housing Element Survey. Your voice matters! In the upcoming weeks, there will be an opportunity to review the draft 6th Cycle Housing Element. Here's what's coming up:





POWERING UP IN SIGNAL HILL WITH EV CHARGING



The City of Signal Hill is proud to offer three public ChargePoint charging stations for EV drivers.

GET RID OF FURNITURE, APPLIANCES AND MORE WITH EDCO'S BULKY ITEM PICKUP

EDCO's Free Bulky Item Pickup Week is **Monday, November 2 – Friday, November 6**. Place your bulky items out on the curb on your regularly scheduled collection day that week. If you live in a multi-family building, please contact EDCO no later than the week of October 26 to schedule your free pickup.

EDCO residential customers can also schedule a free bulky item pickup up to two times per year, up to four items per scheduled collection. You must contact EDCO ahead of time to schedule your pickup and affix a Bulky Item tag to each item. HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

EDCO's Household Hazardous and Electronic Waste collection events are on the second and fourth Saturday of each month,

from 9 a.m. – 2 p.m., with COVID-19 safety precautions. All individuals dropping off waste must wear a face covering and remain in their vehicles with windows closed, if possible. Staff will only remove household hazardous and electronic waste from your trunk or pick-up bed. To dispose of sharps, you will be required to exit your vehicle and dispose of them in the designated area yourself.

Household Hazardous Waste is unused or leftover portions of products containing toxic chemicals used around the home. Products labeled Caution, Warning, Danger, Poison, Toxic, Flammable or Corrosive are considered hazardous. E-waste includes lithium-ion batteries, old computers, monitors, televisions, etc. These items should not be placed in your regular trash bin. 




