A Message from Interim City Manager – Joe Hoefgen

It has been a very busy time in Signal Hill! As highlighted below, the last few months have seen the completion of several City projects and the continued progress on a variety of fronts:

Pandemic Response – In terms of Covid-19, we fortunately are in a much better place than we were in either 2020 or 2021. Meetings of the City Council and other City organizations now typically include both an “in person” and remote options for attendance and participation. Thanks to the hard work and dedication of the City’s departments, core Signal Hill operations have continued without interruption throughout the pandemic.

Major Roadway Work – There were significant investments made in Signal Hill’s roadway system in 2022. The City’s capital improvement program in 2022 included two major roadway improvement projects. First, a total of 850,000 square feet of residential streets were slurry sealed throughout town. In addition, a complete grind and overlay of Spring Street from Orange Ave. to Junipero Ave. was completed. These roadway improvements were completed utilizing a variety of local, state, and federal transportation funds.

Park Improvements Completed – The City completed construction of Heritage Point Park in August. The park offers incredible, panoramic views of Signal Hill, downtown Long Beach, the Ports of Long Beach and Los Angeles – and Catalina Island on a clear day! This new park has proven to be very popular with residents who actively enjoy it on a daily basis.

Water Improvements Nearing Completion - Despite supply chain issues caused by the Covid-19 pandemic and other unforeseen circumstances, the Well 10 construction project is close to completion. The new well is currently undergoing performance and quality testing to ensure that the pump operates according to specifications and that the water meets all current code and state standards. We anticipate the well to be in full service and contributing to the City’s potable water supply by the end of the year.

I joined the City of Signal Hill in August of this year and will remain on staff a short while longer until a new City Manager is appointed on a permanent basis. Although my time with the City of Signal Hill is of a limited duration, please feel free to use the general e-mail address for the City Manager’s Office for issues that arise in the future.

BACK TO SCHOOL SAFETY TIPS



As everyone returns to school for the 2022-2023 year, the Signal Hill Police Department would like to remind parents to abide by the following safety tips and to share information with their children to help keep them safe:

WALKING TO SCHOOL:

- Always walk with a buddy or group; avoid talking to strangers
- Before crossing the street, stop and look left, right and left again to see if cars are coming
- Pay attention to your surroundings and do not walk and use electronics

RIDING THE BUS TO SCHOOL:

- Be sure the bus driver can see you
- Never walk behind the bus
- Do not put your head, arms, or legs out the window

RIDING A BIKE TO SCHOOL:

- Always wear a helmet and make sure it fits properly
- Ride on the right side of the road, with traffic, and in single file
- Ride while alert and do not use electronics or wear both ear buds while riding

MOTORISTS:

- Obey all signs, signals, and crossing guards in school zones
- Slow down and watch for children walking/biking to school and for children exiting a school bus
- Do not pass a school bus that is stopped to load or unload children (this is also a citable offense)

We strongly encourage youth participation; however, kids must be accompanied by an adult and have a parent or guardian sign a waiver. LET'S ALL DO OUR PART... SAVE WATER!

On June 10, 2022, the City's Water Conservation Program moved to Level 2 per mandate by the State Water Resources Control Board. Level 2 Restrictions include the following:

- ✓ Watering or irrigating is ONLY allowed 2 days per week on Tuesday and Saturday. Watering is allowed between 4pm and 9am ONLY.
- ✓ Use of automated outdoor irrigation is prohibited within 48 hours following measurable rainfall.
- ✓ Excessive use, loss, or escape of water through leaks, breaks, or other malfunctions in the water user's plumbing must be repaired within 48 hours unless arrangements have been made with the City.
- ✓ Limits on Washing Vehicles: Using potable water to wash vehicles is prohibited except by use of a handheld bucket or similar container and hand-held hose with an automatic shut-off nozzle.

- ✓ Limits on Filling Residential Swimming Pools and Spas: Initial filling of residential swimming pools or outdoor spas with potable water is prohibited. Re-filling a residential pool or spa more than one-foot is prohibited.
- ✓ Commercial Landscape: Owners of commercial, industrial, and institutional properties (INCLUDING common areas of HOAs) MUST NOT use potable water.



Non-Functional Turf is defined as ground cover surface of mowed grass that is solely ornamental and not otherwise used for human recreation purposes. *Grass at City Parks is considered Recreational Turf and is therefore exempt from irrigation restrictions.

ARE YOU REGISTERED TO VOTE?

To be eligible to vote in the November 8 election, you must register to vote no later than Monday, October 24. Check your registration status, update your voter information, and register at lavote.gov.



VOTE BY MAIL – A SAFE, ACCESSIBLE, AND PREFERRED VOTING OPTION

All registered voters in L.A. County will be mailed a Vote by Mail (VBM) ballot. VBM Ballots will be mailed to all voters starting Monday, October 10. You must sign the VBM return envelope before submitting your ballot in order for the County to verify your identity and process the ballot.

IN-PERSON VOTING

Election Day is Tuesday, November 8. Vote Centers open at 7:00 a.m. and close at 8:00 p.m. Vote Center locations will be posted on the City website and at lavote.gov as they become available. Remember, you no longer must vote at a designated polling place. L.A. County voters can vote at any official Vote Center in the County. You can save time at the polls by putting together a sample ballot before heading out. Visit isb.lavote.net to get started.



HOW DO I RETURN MY BALLOT?

- By mail, no postage is necessary
- At any participating VBM Ballot Drop Box location
- At any Vote Center in L.A. County

VBM Ballots must be postmarked by Election Day and received within 7 days by the County. If you choose to drop off your VBM ballot, you must do so by 8:00 p.m. at a VBM Ballot Drop Box location or a Vote Center on Election Day, November 8.



TRACK YOUR VBM BALLOT

You can sign up to track the status of your VBM ballot at WheresMyBallot.sos.ca.gov. You'll receive personalized text messages, emails and/or automated voice messages about your ballot. This is a free service available to all registered voters that gives you updated information when your ballot is mailed, received, and counted.





STREET TREE MASTER PLAN

The City of Signal Hill is updating the Street Tree Master Plan! The Signal Hill Street Tree Master Plan represents a significant opportunity to evaluate the historic identity of the City's urban forest and introduce best management practices that will thrive in longevity.

6TH CYCLE HOUSING ELEMENT UPDATE

California State law requires the City to adopt a General Plan with seven required elements, one of which is the Housing Element. The City's Housing Element identifies Signal Hill's housing needs and opportunities and establishes clear goals and objectives to inform future housing decisions. State law requires the City's Housing Element to be updated every eight years.

With input from members of the public, the City prepared and submitted a Draft 6th Cycle Housing Element to the State Department of Housing and Community Development, and received a letter stating the draft meets the statutory requirements of State Housing Element Law. This is extremely good news as it indicates the State is prepared to certify our Housing Element once it is approved and submitted. Signal

Hill is one of a very few cities in our region to achieve this milestone thus far.

The Planning Commission reviewed and recommended City Council approve the Draft Housing Element Update in June 2022, and it was presented to the City Council for review and approval on September 27, 2022. It was submitted to the State for certification prior to the October 15, 2022, deadline.

The Community Development Department would like to thank residents who sent comments and questions about the draft element, and Signal Hill Petroleum for their partnership in identifying potential housing sites.

HERITAGE POINT PARK

On July 8 the City held a Grand Opening for Heritage Point Park with 75 guests in attendance. Home Depot sponsored a succulent planting experience for those in attendance. The park contains multiple seating areas for viewing, a walking trail that connects Skyline Drive to Creston Avenue, and provides pedestrian access to City Hall. COMMEMORATIVE FLAGS

Since 2019, the City has adopted a commemorative flag policy to allow for the rotating display of commemorative flags underneath the City flag at City Hall, the Public Library, and the Police Station. Each flag represents a specific group and/or event. The goal is to celebrate groups and their rich contributions. Each flag aims to educate and inform the public regarding the group's presence, history, and achievements.

For 2022, the City featured 10 different flags celebrating: National Law Enforcement, Black History, Women's History, World Health Workers, Public Service, Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage, LGBTQ+ Pride and Harvey Milk Day, Labor Day and our current and upcoming events below. 
NATIVE AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH: NOVEMBER 1 – NOVEMBER 30

The month of November is a time to celebrate rich and diverse cultures, traditions, and histories, and to acknowledge the important contributions of Native people. Native American Heritage Month is also a time to educate the public about tribes, to raise a general awareness about the unique challenges Native people have faced both historically, in the present, and the ways in which tribal citizens have worked to conquer these challenges.

CITY PLANNING NEWS

GATEWAY CENTER NORTH SPECIFIC PLAN (SP-12)

- The project creates the Gateway Center North commercial center and includes a remodel to the existing Target store, development of a new self-storage facility, and the addition of three new retail pads.
- The Target remodel is nearly complete and the bright and shiny new Target is open for business.
- The self-storage project has construction drawings in plan check to obtain building permits.
- There is no firm construction start date at this time.



1900 TEMPLE SINGLE FAMILY HOME AND ACCESSORY DWELLING UNIT

- The single-family home was approved by the Planning Commission in April 2022.
- Construction drawings have not yet been submitted for plan check.



AUHS/AURA SPECIFIC PLAN (SP-25)

- The project allows the existing American University of Health Sciences (AUHS) to expand their programs to include a School of Medicine, a pediatric clinic and associated pharmacy.
- Allows a new American University Research Academy (AURA) private high school to operate at the site, beginning in 2022 with a 20-student freshman class.



AB 1276

On October 5, 2021, Governor Gavin Newsom signed into Law, AB 1276 which prohibits food facilities from providing single-use foodware and condiments without first being requested by a consumer.

On June 28, 2022, the Signal Hill City Council held a public hearing to introduce an ordinance adding Chapter 8.14 to the Signal Hill Municipal Code, relating to Single-Use Foodware Accessories and Condiments. On July 12, 2022, the ordinance was adopted.

Signal Hill Residents can report violations of AB 1276 by using the "Service Request" portal found on the City's Website. The following single-use items are regulated under AB 1276:

Residents living in apartments or condominium communities can also take part in the Fall Cleanup. Multi-family managers are required to call the EDCO office in advance of the cleanup at (562) 597-0608, no later than November 2nd, to schedule a day during the cleanup week for tenants to place unwanted items at the curb.

Items that can be disposed during the Bulky Item Week include:

- ✓ broken appliances
- ✓ water heaters
- ✓ furniture
- ✓ old mattresses (please wrap prior to setting out in special mattress disposal bags)
- ✓ tree branches (must be cut into 3' lengths and tied securely into bundles not greater than 18" in diameter)

DOG LICENSE RENEWAL

Dog licenses are required to be renewed each year. To purchase a dog license from the Community Services Department, please present a current rabies inoculation certificate (must be good for the entire licensing period). For all new dog licenses, a certificate of sterility if the dog has been spayed or neutered must be shown.

The City of Signal Hill contracts with the City of Long Beach Animal Care for services. All dogs, age four months and older, are required to have a current dog license by local municipal code (Signal Hill SHMC 6.04.030).



Dog License Costs:

- ◆ \$95 Unaltered
- ◆ \$20 Altered
- ◆ \$10 Altered – (Seniors Age 60+) – good for one dog per household
- ◆ \$30 Late Fee
- ◆ \$10 Dog License Tag/ Replacement Tags

Subsidized transportation programs are available to Signal Hill residents who are age 62 or older or are 18 years and older and provide a proof of disability signed by a licensed physician.
