WIRELESS PRINTING

Wireless printing is available for all Signal Hill Public Library cardholders. Send a print job from your laptop or desktop computer at home or from your mobile device while visiting us. Visit our Wireless Printing page for instructions.

STUDY SPACE

Reading areas, tables, computers, and 2 study rooms are available on a first-come, first-served basis to provide space for relaxing, researching, studying, and enjoying Library materials.

Study rooms are first-come, first-served and can only be reserved on the day of the reservation. Reservations are for 1 hour. Study rooms close 15 minutes prior to closing. Visit the Reference Desk with your library card to reserve a study room.

INTER-LIBRARY LOAN

Patrons may request books and other materials unavailable at the Signal Hill Public Library through our Inter-Library Loan Program. Patrons will be charged \$3.00 per request.

LIBRARY SERVICES FOR PEOPLE WITH PRINT DISABILITIES

California's Library Services for People with Print Disabilities, in association with the Library of Congress, provides free Braille and audio books, magazines and playback equipment to all eligible Californians unable to read standard print. Follow the California's Library Services link to find your local braille and talking book library and sign up for free library service.

PUBLIC ACCESS COMPUTERS

Patrons wishing to utilize the computers must possess a valid library card. Reservations are available on a first-come-first-served basis. Flash drives are available for use.

- Adults ages 18 and over may utilize a computer for one hour per day with limited additional time if no other patrons are waiting.
- Youths ages 10 to 17 may have internet access with signed permission from a parent or legal guardian.
- Children ages 4 to 9 may have access to pre-programmed educational games.
- Children under 4 must have a parent with them at all times while using the computer.

Computer Print-out Fees: \$0.20 per page in black-and-white. \$0.35 per page in color.

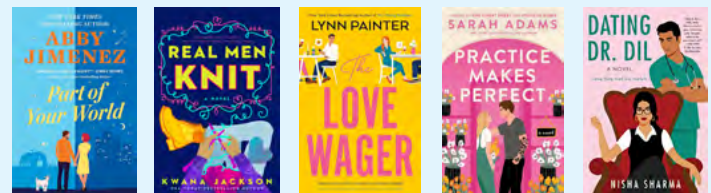

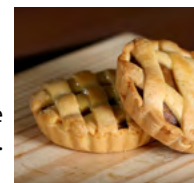

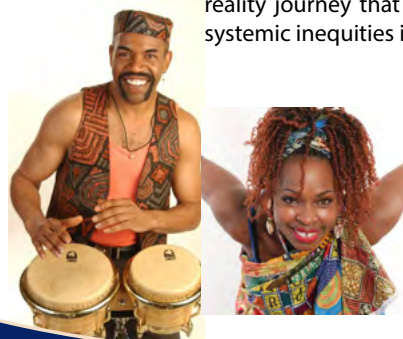

DOG LICENSE RENEWAL

The City of Signal Hill contracts with the City of Long Beach Animal Care for services. All dogs, age four months and older, are required to have a current dog license by local municipal code (Signal Hill SHMC 6.04.030).

Dog licenses are required to be renewed each year. To purchase a dog license from the Parks, Recreation, and Library Services Department (formerly Community Services), please present a current rabies inoculation certificate (must be good for the entire licensing period). For all new dog licenses, a certificate of sterility if the dog has been spayed or neutered must be shown.

DOG LICENSE COSTS:

- \$95 Unaltered
- \$20 Altered
- \$10 Altered – (Age 60+) – good for one dog per household
- \$30 Late Fee
- \$10 Dog License Tag/Replacement Tags

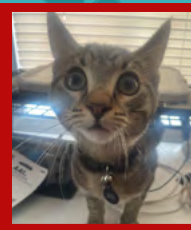
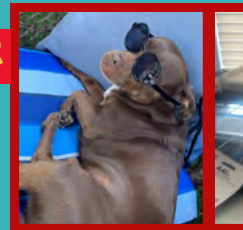
