


COMMUNITY PHOTO & YOUTH ART CONTEST

SIGNAL HILL: ONE HUNDRED YEARS AND MORE

Three sixty feet above the blue
Signal Hill proudly stands
With views declared by many
As the finest in the land.

For millennia the native tribes
Revered this special place
To live and procreate then die
And sustain the Tongva race

They lived a simple peaceful life
And worshipped Mother Earth
Passed traditions down through
spoken word
With approbation, tinged with mirth

The men would hunt for fish and game
The women from fields would gather
Fruits, nuts, maize and medicines,
To enhance their tribal platter

They used smoke in effective ways
To make their hunting keener
And one day realized the fumes they made
Could be seen from Catalina

Thus one time known as 'Bay of Smokes'
Thence Los Cerritos, 'Little Hill'
But with functionality realized
'Twas renamed Loma Cental, 'Signal Hill'

The Indians would travel
With other tribes to trade
Food, clothing, trinkets; tar for boats
All caringly hand made.

In seventeen hundred and eighty four
Came Don Manuel Nieto
Whose 300,000 acre grant of land
Became the first white ghetto

The land spawned six huge ranchos
Of which some remain today
Best known: Rancho Los Cerritos
Preserved for historic display

So many streets we walk today
Bear names of first land owners
Stearns, Temple, Bixby, Figueroa
And many other personas

The ranchos were used for farming
Grazing, livestock and agriculture
Zinnias, pumpkins, hay and dewberries
Even a dairy for cheese manufacture

By dawn of twentieth century
Stately mansions topped the hill
Drawn by three sixty vistas
That to this day, still thrill.

By nineteen hundred and sixteen
Oil drilling had begun
All unsuccessful ventures
'Till Well Alamitos No 1

On June 23rd, nineteen twenty one
To everyone's surprise
This well became a gusher
Before startled observers' eyes

The drill bit hit a pool of oil
Then, richest in the world
And with this nascent business
A new economy unfurled

Splendid homes were soon demolished
As peace turned topsy turvy
Replaced by wooden derricks tall
Spewing crude oil, black and dirty

One thousand wells in all were drilled
In this oil boom sensation
Where mega fortunes were won and lost
By investors throughout the nation

Then Long Beach demanded an oil tax
From this unincorporated area
But Jessie Nelson said, "No way,

So on April 14th, nineteen twenty four
One hundred years ago this day
Jessie Nelson became the first lady mayor
To launch Signal Hill on its way.

To mop up relics of the oily past
Restore views and parks and beauty
Revive a place to work live and play
And gestate a new economy.

To our current elected councillors:
Copeland, Hansen, Jones, Wilson, and
Mayor Woods
Your dedication is appreciated
In this distinguished neighborhood.

So Congratulations Signal Hill
On this, your first centenary!
May your continued growth maintain
In a manner quite exemplary.

Three sixty feet above Long Beach
Signal Hill proudly stands
With views and lifestyle acclaimed by most
As elegant and grand.

To purchase a dog license from the Parks, Recreation and Library Services Department, please present a current rabies inoculation certificate (must be good for the entire licensing period). For all new dog licenses, a certificate of sterility if the dog has been spayed or neutered must be shown.

The City of Signal Hill contracts with the City of Long Beach Animal Care for services. All dogs, age four months and older, are required to have a current dog license by local municipal code (Signal Hill SHMC 6.04.030).
