Business Spotlight

Tanuki Curry House:

A Taste of Japan in Signal Hill

Tanuki Curry House is serving up more than just Japanese comfort food, it's sharing a family story. Owner and chef Erwin Angeles credits his son, Victor, as the inspiration behind the restaurant's concept. What began as a father's wish to share good food with his son has grown into a welcoming spot where the community can savor the same flavors.

At the center of the menu is a curry that takes 24 hours to make. "We use S&B curry powder, the same as in Japan, but we toast it. We caramelize the onions, carrots, apples, and tomato paste. We make it sing," Angeles explains. The result is a sauce that's rich, hearty, and deeply satisfying, served with rice, crispy cutlets, or steaming bowls of udon.



Angeles also credits the business ecosystem within Signal Hill for helping bring Tanuki Curry House to life. "We found the City of Signal Hill to be very business-friendly, extremely accommodating and genuinely helpful. The small-town feel gives a sense of togetherness, like they've got your back," he says. Tanuki Curry House is proof that comfort food, family inspiration, and community support can come together to create something truly special.



STUDY SPACE

Reading areas, tables, computers, and study rooms are available on a first-come, first-served basis to provide space for relaxing, researching, studying, and enjoying Library materials. Study rooms are first-come, first-served and can be reserved up to a week in advance. Reservations are for 2 hours. Study rooms close 15 minutes prior to closing. Visit the Reference Desk with your library card to reserve a study room or visit our Library catalog.

INTER-LIBRARY LOAN

Patrons may request books and other materials unavailable at the Signal Hill Public Library through our Inter-Library Loan Program. Patrons will be charged \$3.00 per request.

LIBRARY SERVICES FOR PEOPLE WITH PRINT DISABILITIES

California's Library Services for People with Print Disabilities, in association with the Library of Congress, provides free Braille and audio books, magazines and playback equipment to all eligible Californians unable to read standard print. Follow the California's Library Services link to find your local braille and talking book library and sign up for free library service.

PUBLIC ACCESS COMPUTERS

Patrons wishing to utilize the computers must possess a valid library card. Reservations are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Flash drives are available for use.

- Adults ages 18 and older may utilize a computer for one hour per day with limited additional time if no other patrons are waiting.
- Youths ages 10 to 17 may have internet access with signed permission from a parent or legal guardian.
- Children ages 4 to 9 may have access to pre-programmed educational games.
- Children younger than 4 must have a parent with them at all times while using the computer.

Computer Print-out Fees: \$0.20 per page in black-and-white. \$0.35 per page in color.

The City of Signal Hill provides a monthly supplement of groceries for families and senior citizens in need of support. These programs are available to low-income Signal Hill residents by application only and available on a first come, first-served basis. Family Food Distribution Program: Eligible families receive a monthly allocation to Mother's Nutritional Market.

Senior Food Distribution Program: Eligible senior citizens receive a monthly distribution of supplemental groceries.

SUBSIDIZED TRANSPORTATION

Or that dog waste contains disease causing bacteria and parasites that may be harmful to humans and other pets? Help keep your pets safe and our City clean by picking up after your pet.





DOG LICENSE RENEWAL

The City of Signal Hill contracts with the City of Long Beach Animal Care for services. All dogs, age four months and older, are required to have a current dog license by local municipal code (Signal Hill SHMC 6.04.030).

Dog licenses are required to be renewed each year. To purchase a dog license from the Parks, Recreation, and Library Services Department, please present a current rabies inoculation certificate (must be good for the entire licensing period). For all new dog licenses, a certificate of sterility if the dog has been spayed or neutered must be shown.

DOG LICENSE COSTS:

- \$250 Unaltered
- \$28 Altered
- \$14 Altered - (Age 60+) - good for one dog per household
- \$15 Late Fee
- \$10 Dog License Tag/Replacement Tags

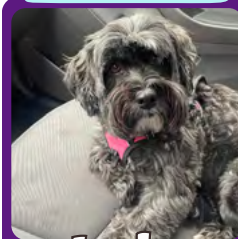
